My neighborhood is designed for privacy. If I didn't want too, I would never have to see my neighbors. Unfortunately many neighborhoods are designed this way. Robert Putnam's "Bowling Alone" study measured the decline in participation in the ways we have historically come together as a society to build and stay in relationships, support each other and figure out to better our local communities. These are places like neighborhoods, the dinner table, Rotary Clubs, faith communities and city council. He said that Americans are bowling more than ever, but bowling leagues are struggling. We are "Bowling Alone". It is in this very divided and siloed context that hate, lack of awareness or indifference to our neighbor's struggles, and can thrive. It is in this context that most Missoulians don't know we can have 30 homeless families not even able to get into shelter.

MIC is about strengthening and building new bridges among our congregations and working to reweave the social fabric of our communities, all toward the end of tackling our communities' most pressing social challenges. In the past month our 20 Building Bridges-Building Leaders Partner Congregations have begun to make a move. They are training up leaders who are energized and effective at inspiring a mobilizing people to bridge new relationships, work together and tackle social challenges in a collaborative fashion. I can't wait to be a part of tackling our next social challenge together!
