- We have supported no fewer than 8 charities directly

- associated with our Native American sisters and brothers.
- We have become a partner with the Rio Grande Borderlands Ministry and sponsored two pilgrimages to learn about the humanitarian crisis at our southern border.

And, we've had scores of dedicated parishioners over the past two decades volunteering at a local health center and at food banks, building houses for Habitat for Humanity and teaching English to teachers in Myanmar.

## Dear Mom with that noisy kid in church

(adapted from an article by Daron Pratt on the website Mums at the Table)

I want you to know you are doing something really important when you parent in the pew. I want you to know that what you do is significant now and for eternity. I want you to know that it is worth it.

I notice you flustered and overloaded with a diaper bag, snacks, and children, juggling them all as you come in the door and struggle to a seat. I know all too well the battle you have had to get the children up, fed, dressed and to church. It is real, it is messy, it seems so unholy at times, but know that it is worth it. I notice you nervously trying to shush the children and keep them quiet and occupied during church. I notice the disapproving stares, frowns, and clicks of the tongue.

I hear the children's questions and loud observations of what we do and why we do this thing we call worship. I notice the children watching the adults, observing as they sing, pray, give the offering, and read the scriptures. I notice them taking their turn sitting on Aunt Gertrude's lap because she is so welcoming to all the children. I notice them rubbing shoulders with the congregation, watching, listening, interacting, mimicking, making a joyful noise and playing their part—a very important part in the community of faith. Jesus noticed it too and rebuked the disciples when they declared, "Adults only."

I notice because the kingdom of heaven is present when children are present in our worship. Church worship is the nursery of the Holy Spirit. Church worship is messy, it is authentic, it is spontaneous, and it is real. In the long run, it seeps into their bones. I notice because I would rather have a fractious baby present as a sign of the kingdom than none at all. I would rather have interrupted moments of holy pandemonium than none at all. I would rather welcome a child into the pew than send them out the back. If I see a rambunctious child running towards the pulpit or an excited child dancing on the pews because it's church time, I inwardly fist pump (sometimes outwardly) because the kingdom of heaven is very

So mum, next week, when you struggle to get your child ready and present in the pew, remember it is worth it. Know that the thrills and spills of parenting in the pew are worth it and know that what you are doing for your children has eternal repercussions. We teach our children about God best when we parent in the pew in an intergenerational environment. It is you, with your children, worshipping God together.

Because of this, I applaud our parents and do all I can to encourage them in the pew—it's so worth it.




Centering Prayer meets the third Tuesday of the month at 4 p.m.

### Several properties projects on tap

Now the Vestry has approved the same contractor to repaint the Parish Hall and the small area just outside the kitchen and Guild Room. This is something we have been ready to do for several years, and now we have someone to do it. Once the painting is complete, get ready for the wood floor

to be sanded and refinished. No doubt, the Parish Hall will reflect all kinds of new energy and light! The Vestry also approved the cleaning and sealing of all the actual church building gutters along with installation of rain gutter covers to prevent the buildup of debris year after year. If it prevents the problem of debris buildup, then our other buildings with gutters may receive the same treatment.

The ship is leaving the harbor, and soon it will unfurl the sails for the adventure before us. Thanks be to God for all that has made this possible from those who have remembered the parish in their wills!

## When does Baptism take place at Holy Spirit?

Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church. Baptism takes place during the Easter Vigil service (Saturday evening, in April), and at a Sunday service about three times a year: the Day of Pentecost (the first Sunday in June this year), the Sunday after All Saints' Day (early November), and the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the first Sunday after Epiphany, in early January). Baptism may also take place when the bishop visits (in December this year), and on a Sunday during the summer on a date to be determined. If you are interested in Baptism for yourself or for your child, preparation needs to take place. Please contact the office at (406) 542-2167 to speak with our rector, The Rev. Terri Ann Grotzinger.

The next date for Baptism will be on the Sunday after All Saints' Day, November 6, at the 10:15 am service.

## Put yourself in their shoes

There are so many personal stories, reflections, inspirations, etc. generated by our journey to the Border and the work of the Rio Grande Borderland Ministry, and hopefully this series will give you that variety and flavor.

We are all children of parents, some of us are parents, and some of us grandparents. I ask that you put yourself in the mindset of a family in Nicaragua, El Salvador, Honduras, Haiti, any of the Central American countries. You have a job, you have a family that you love, you have meals together, you have celebrations, you have your faith community, and you have JOY! And then one day and over a series of days/months, that lifestyle is threatened. Your husband is beaten and threatened with his life. Your wife gets threatening phone calls that her family will be killed. You walk outside, and a stranger is talking with your little girl. You approach, and a gun is pointed at her head. The life that you celebrated is ending; everything that you hold dear is threatened, and unheard-of decisions must be made. You must

pack as little as possible, you must pay thousands of dollars, and you must put you and your family's wellbeing in the hands of strangers and trust they will be safe.

The journey itself will be lifethreatening (engagement with cartel members along the way to extort/kill you), it will be frightening (left in the desert in the middle of the night), and the promised land is illusory. AND yet they come. They come with hope, with joy, with the expectation that they can escape an impossible situation. What is important to know these families do not want to be where they are headed, they do not want to be where they are delivered; what they really want is to return to their home and the life they had. AND yet they come.

Certainly, as a country with unlimited abundance, it is not too great a sacrifice for us to not only welcome them, but to welcome them joyously and lovingly. These families will help us be the type of country and people we aspire to be!


