As we remain at home....

I've been surprised during this pandemic how I have gravitated back to all things foundational. It makes sense. When we are shaken we return to what is familiar, tried and true. If you haven't already, we encourage you to turn to the Book of Common Prayer and the hymnal as resources that have stood the test of time. You might check out:

- Daily Devotions for Individuals and Families, page 136 BCP. These short meditations include Scripture, prayers and a collect, and they are framed around the hours of the day: morning, noon, evening, close of day. Reading these could bring a grounding rhythm to your day.
- Morning Prayer, page 75, noon prayer, page 103 and evening prayer, page 115 are somewhat beefier options. Compline is always a lovely way to close the day, page 127.
- Explore the hymnal. Use the Index of First Lines on page

954 and find some of your favorite hymns to either sing or merely read (the words can be amazing). Here are a couple of less known hymns that Nancy Cooper suggests we look at, as they seem to hold particular poignancy for us at this time. *O God of Earth and Altar*, page 591 and *Dear Lord and Father of Mankind*, page 652.

Don't have a Book of Common Prayer or a hymnal? We have copies you can use. Contact Rev. Gretchen at the church office, 542-2167 and gretchen@holyspiritmissoula.org. Or check out these online hymn resources https://hymnary.org/ or https://www.riteseries.org/song/browse/. Try the electronic version of the Book of Common Prayer https://www.bcponline.org/.

Church School Kickoff 2020 God goes with us

Kick-Off Sunday is September 13th, and though we won't be meeting in person, we will celebrate the beginning of another Church School year with a special intergenerational worship service online. Designed specifically with kids and families in mind, we invite you to watch, celebrate, and worship, as we start another school year, remembering that *God Goes with Us*.

Our Old Testament lesson for the day is the story of Moses and the Israelites crossing the Red Sea. You might want to read the story ahead of time with your family, Exodus 14:19-31. In the story we learn that God went both before and behind the Israelites on their journey out of Egypt, travelling with them and keeping them safe. In these times of strange uncertainty, it is a comforting reminder to hold: *God Goes with Us*.

In the Exodus story God goes with the people in a pillar of cloud. It may be fun and helpful for children to imagine God going with them to school, in the hallway, in the classroom, on the playground. What creative shape do they imagine God might take in those places?

What can you expect this fall? As we wait and learn how this virus will respond to schools opening up, we will continue to offer online options for children and families. As long as the building remains closed, we will offer a mix of intergenerational worship experiences along with some children's messages, designed just for kids, like we did last spring. At this point we anticipate offering intergenerational worship the first Sunday of the month and then offering children's messages on the other Sundays. This pattern may change as we strive to be responsive to needs as they emerge.

Please do not hesitate to reach out and let us know of what is most helpful for you and your family at this time.

Opportunities to cultivate, challenge and live our faith

Coming in September Holy Spirit offers True Colors training series

Black Lives Matter. As people of faith we shout a resounding YES of course, and yet we know that inequalities and injustices continue to persist in our society. Additionally, we are not only paralyzed about what actions will help, we may unwittingly be contributing to the injustice.

True Colors White Allies is a program that provides the opportunity to take an up close and personal look at race and to think together with members of your church family about how we can respond in both personal and systemic ways. Learn about the history of racism and the structures and systems that support racism through weekly group discussion and optional reading assignments outside of class time.

True Colors White Allies: Created for white-identity people who are interested in self-exploration, ending guilt, understanding invisible prejudices, deconstructing individual and institutional racism, and strengthening active allyship. This safe space provides room for we white people to make honest mistakes and to struggle with our own prejudices and misunderstanding without burdening or causing further harm to people of color. The True Colors White Allies series provides an opportunity for participants to examine their relationship to racism, exploring the ways whiteness operates on individual, interpersonal, cultural, and institutional levels. This series bridges theory, critical reflection, and practice and aims to prepare participants to continue their own life-long learning regarding deconstructing white dominance while developing the tools to be leaders in empowering others to do the same. The 8-week series will be weekly in the parish hall on Thursdays from 6:00-8:00 p.m. beginning on September 3, 2020 and ending October 22, 2020.

Facts about blood donors

- One donation can save the lives of up to three people.
- The number one reason donors say they give blood is because they "want to help others."
- Two most common reasons cited by people who don't give blood are "Never thought about it" and "I don't like needles."
- Forty-five percent of people in the U.S. have type O (positive or negative) blood.

Holy Spirit Fall blood drive scheduled for September 24

We need your help. The American Red Cross has a higher than usual need for donors right now. Between March and June of 2020, COVID-19 closures resulted in the cancellation of 37,000 blood drives and hundreds of thousands of donation appointments. While the supply of donated blood has substantially diminished, the need for blood has remained constant. Donated blood is a lifesaving, essential part of caring for medical patients. On September 24th, between 1:00 and 6:00 p.m., Holy Spirit will support the American Red Cross by hosting our annual fall blood drive.

Worried about giving blood during the pandemic? The Center for Disease Control (CDC) encourages people who are well to continue to donate blood, and the American Red Cross has implemented safety and infection control measures specifically for COVID-19. Each blood drive follows CDC recommendations that will keep donors and staff safe. These measures include:

- Checking temperatures of staff and donors before entering a drive to make sure they are healthy.
- Providing hand sanitizer for use before the drive, as well as throughout the donation process.
- Following social distancing between donors including entry, donation, and refreshment areas.
- Ensuring face masks or coverings

are worn by both staff and donors.

- Routinely disinfecting surfaces, equipment, and donor-touched areas.
- Wearing gloves and changing gloves often.
- Using sterile collection sets and an aseptic scrub for every donation.

Due to COVID-19, our fall blood drive sign up process will be slightly different. Donors are asked to sign up for an appointment using the Red Cross online scheduling system at www.redcrossblood.org, or by contacting Audrey Murray at 612-968-2108 or at audreymurray196@gmail.com. As usual, we need volunteers to register donors and serve refreshments. To volunteer, please contact Audrey (612-968-2108;

audreymurray196@gmail.com). Not sure if you can be a donor? Here's what you need to know:

- You must be in good health and feeling well.
- You must weigh at least 110 pounds.
- If you are not yet 18 years old, you must have a consent form signed by your parent or guardian. Additional height and weight restrictions apply to



those 18 years or younger. Please check with the Red Cross for eligibility. The most frequent exclusions are for those who have traveled in certain foreign countries or have low iron (hematocrit count).

Remember, if you are a regular Red Cross donor, you must allow 56 days between donations, so if you donated blood after July 30, you will not be able to donate on September 24th. For answers to further questions relating to donating blood, call the Red Cross at 1-855-210-1278.

Please plan to give at the blood drive.
